Kansas Geological Society

Article III, Section 9 Code of Ethics

The Code of Ethics which follows represents the thinking of most professional geologists and has been in part taken from the Code of Ethics of the American Association of Petroleum Geologists, of which the Kansas Geological Society is an affiliated society.

- (a) Each member of the Society, of whatever classification, shall be guided by the highest standards of business ethics, personal honor and professional conduct. Geology is a profession and the privilege of professional practice requires professional morality and professional responsibility. Honesty, integrity, loyalty, fairness, impartiality, candor, fidelity to trust and confidence are incumbent upon every member.
- (b) A member will not falsely or maliciously attempt to injure the reputation or business of another.
- (c) A member will freely give credit for work done by others to whom the credit is due and will refrain from plagiarism in oral and written communications.
- (d) A member will endeavor to cooperate with others in the Society and profession and will encourage the ethical dissemination of geological knowledge and information.
- (e) A member having knowledge of unethical practices or dishonest acts by another member will avoid, as far as possible, association with that member in professional work, and will bring to the attention of the Board of Directors such practices or acts.
- (f) By applying for or continuing membership, of whatever classification, in the Society, every member agrees to uphold the standards set out in the Code of Ethics.

Article III, Section 10 Grievance Proceedings

A member accused of conduct or acts which are in violation of the Code of Ethics or the best interest of the Society shall be notified in writing, by certified mail, to appear before the Board for a hearing. After said hearing and by an affirmative vote of at least 5 members of the full Board, the member may be:

- 1. Cleared of any wrongful conduct or acts;
- 2. Censured;
- 3. Allowed to resign for a stated period of time:
- 4. Expelled from any classification of membership in the Society without any rights for reinstatement in the future.

In the event the accused member fails to appear at the designated hearing with the Board, the Board will give full consideration to the evidence at hand and vote accordingly.

Should an affirmative vote of at least 5 members of the full Board not be attained at this hearing, this complaint against the member shall be dropped and the member shall be considered to be in good standing in the Society.

Article III, Section 11 Liability

Every person applying for membership or continuing their membership, of whatever classification, in the Society, agrees that neither the Society nor any officer, director or member of the Society shall be individually or jointly liable in any manner for their action on a membership application, or for disciplinary action taken against a member in accordance with the Constitution of the Society.
