



Kansas Geological Society (KGS) Medallion for Scientific Distinction and Excellence

The Kansas Geological Society (KGS) Medallion for Scientific Distinction and Excellence may be given annually for peer-recognized, sustained significant scientific contributions to all facets of applied Kansas geology, including work either in Kansas or in surrounding states if the latter contributions pertain directly and significantly to Kansas geology. No more than one award may be given each year, an award does not have to be given every year, and members of the KGS Awards Committee that handle nominations for this award cannot nominate themselves for this award. The candidates need not be active KGS members, and they must be living at the time of selection. The primary consideration in the selection of a candidate shall be his or her sustained, published, significant contributions to any facet of Kansas geology. Contributions may be varied in form such as development of geologic concepts, advancement in discovery thinking, and recognized leadership in exploration concepts. Oral and/or written publications in peer-reviewed geological venues is a requisite criterion for any candidate for this award. The name of a candidate shall be presented by the Awards Committee to the KGS Board of Directors for their approval. Once approved, the recipient shall be presented an appropriate award in the form of a medallion or plaque recommended by the Awards Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at the annual business meeting of the society. This is a new award given by the KGS for distinction and achievement in Geological research in Kansas.

Awards Committee members are Sal Mazzullo, Mike Dealy and Alfred James.

Missing reference books and periodicals from the KGS Resource Room



The field trip, led by Drs. Christopher Fielding and R.M. "Matt" Joeckel, will see participants traveling through southeastern Nebraska to examine a series of Pennsylvanian exposures, comprising thick fluvial and estuarine sandstones overlain by thin-bedded sandstones-mudrocks that are incised into the limestone-mudrock cycles typical of the latest Pennsylvanian (Virgilian) succession of SE Nebraska. Participants will gain an appreciation for the diagnosis of sedimentary environments in these strata, their stacking patterns, and their capacity to act as reservoirs of natural fluids. The ndian Cave Sandstone is a producing oil reservoir horizon in southern Kansas.



Gary Stuart Sandlin By Kathie Sandlin

Gary Stuart Sandlin was born June 10, 1933, and passed away on January 5, 2017, at St. Anthony's North Hospital, Westminster, Colorado. He is survived by his wife Kathie Sandlin, daughter, Laura Rodriguez Sandlin and her husband, Paul Rodriguez, stepson, Billy Kimbrough, sister, Karen Summers, brother, Steve Sandlin, and his wife Cathy, many nieces and nephews, previous wife, Betty Keiswetter Higbie, and her husband, Lee. He was preceded in death by his parents, Edwin and Mary (Dorman) Sandlin, son Jeff Sandlin, brother, Arlen Sandlin, and brother, Curtis Sandlin.

Gary worked as a geologist in the oil industry for more than 50 years. Raised on a farm in Graham County, Kansas, he began working in the oil fields of western Kansas after graduation from high school in 1951 and continued working on drilling rigs during



summers through 1955, when he earned his bachelor's degree in geology from K-State

Upon graduating from K-State, he worked for Dowell, Inc. as a junior service engineer until 1956, when he returned to K-State as a graduate student. After earning his master's degree in geology in 1957, Sandlin worked as a geologist with Pubco Petroleum in Casper, Wyoming. He then transferred to Albuquerque, N.M. in 1959 to work as a district geologist in the mid-continent and Denver Basin regions.

In 1961 he was transferred to Denver, Colorado, where he worked in the same capacity until 1965, when he began his career as an independent geologist. In 1977, Sandlin incorporated Sandlin Oil Corporation, which his wife and daughter still own and operate.

Gary was a member of the Kansas Geological Society, American Association of Petroleum Geologists, Rocky Mountain Association of Petroleum Geologists, and a member of the Kansas State Geology Advisory Board at Kansas State University. Gary was very supportive of the geology department at K-State and created the Gary and Kathie Sandlin Geology Scholarship to help those interested in geology. He also contributed to the proposed K-State Geosciences Building. The Alumni Fellows Program sponsored by the President's office, the Dean's Council and the K-State Alumni Association honored Gary as a Fellow in April, 2014. Gary enjoyed traveling to he K-State football bowl games following his "Wildcats" and enjoyed talking geology and football with his many friends and their wives.

A memorial has been established with the Kansas Geological Foundation.

MEMORIES OF GARY WILKINS From Gary Penley, Petroleum Geologist

Gary C. Wilkins, geologist, mentor, and forever friend, passed from this life on January 24, 2017. In a successful career of fifty-plus years, Gary held various positions—both technical and managerial—in Magnolia Petroleum, Mobil, Lear Petroleum, Mesa Petroleum, Calvin Exploration, and Hawkeye Exploration.

Gary's work took him to residences in Mt. Vernon, Illinois; Wichita, Kansas; Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; and Denver, Colorado. His exploration experience extended through an impressive number of geologic basins: the Anadarko Basin, Arkoma Basin, Texas Panhandle, Illinois Basin, Michigan Basin, Great Valley of California, Santa Barbara Channel, Southern California offshore, the North Slope of Alaska, and all of Kansas.

In a manner reminiscent of his entire life, Gary planned his own funeral—chose the flowers, the music, picked out his casket, and wrote his own obituary.

Surprisingly, Gary admitted an inability to write this "Blurb"—his word, not mine—to be published after his death. He honored me by asking me to write it. I do hope this blurb proves satisfactory, lest my outspoken friend give me a final chewing out from his current residence—a place largely unknown to us except for the undeniable fact that Gary is surely influential up there—at least second in command.


Personality wise, Gary Wilkins was a walking contradiction—a living dichotomy.

The persona that Gary presented—tough, fearless—was not an empty facade. Unlike many who act like tough guys, Gary really was a tough guy.




